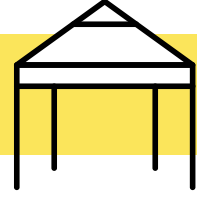

October Events



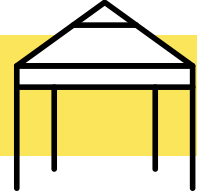
