**ENVIRONMENTAL LEADERSHIP RECOGNIZED ONCE AGAIN**

**ATLANTA** – Pull-A-Part has always been dedicated to the preservation and sustainability of the environment. They continue to be active in their efforts in building cleaner and healthier communities and were honored again today by receiving the “Clean Tech Innovation Award” at the Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce E3 Awards.

The Atlanta E3 Awards recognizes companies, organizations, and individuals who work to conserve metro Atlanta’s natural resources, develop clean technology to enhance our economy, and support sustainable initiatives. Pull-A-Part was recognized for its efforts in creating sustainable solutions in the recycling sector.

“The Metro Atlanta Chamber is pleased to recognize Pull-A-Part for its contributions to the clean technology industry in metro Atlanta,” said Dave Williams, vice president of Infrastructure and Government Affairs at the Metro Atlanta Chamber. “Pull-A-Part’s unique reclamation process demonstrates their commitment to environmental stewardship and sustainability.”

Pull-A-Part's reclamation and recycling process reduces waste from scrapped cars by 21% as opposed to the typical car being shredded. Approximately 500,000 vehicles reach the end of their lives annually in Georgia, but Pull-A-Part prevents nearly three million pounds of waste from entering Georgia landfills annually. To date, Pull-A-Part has also recovered 40,408 mercury switches from old vehicles in metro Atlanta, preventing mercury contamination of more than 5.5 billion gallons of water.

Environmental sustainability is not Pull-A-Part's only concern. Pull-A-Part proudly serves their communities with recycling efforts and sponsorships. Each year, Pull-A-Part participates in events across their 28 locations in 13 states. The most recent event was hosting the DeKalb County, Georgia Fire Rescue extrication training where 36 recruits spent the day practicing vehicle extrication exercises using vehicles provided by Pull-A-Part.
