Pull-A-Part Recognized for Environmental Practices



Automotive used parts retailer Pull-A-Part received a proclamation from the Governor Sonny Perdue and the Georgia House of Representatives, commending the company's efforts on incorporating sustainability principles and environmental management systems into their businesses. The proclamation was made during Sustainable Business Day recently.

"We are very proud to be recognized as one of the leaders in sustainable business in Georgia," stated Ross Kogon, Chief of Staff for Pull-A-Part. "It is an honor to be acknowledged as a company that is investing in Georgia's environmental future."

As part of Pull-A-Part's efforts to maintain a sustainable and environmentally friendly business, the company recycles over 50,000 gallons of oil, gasoline, brake fluid, transmission fluid, Freon and antifreeze, as well as thousands of lead-acid batteries, per year at each of its three Georgia locations. In addition, based on recycling an average of 3,000 tons of automobiles each month at the Georgia locations, Pull-A-Part's unique de-pollution process prevents over 4 million pounds of waste from entering Georgia landfills annually.

Founded in 1997, Pull-A-Part is a fourth-generation, family-owned used auto parts retailer that provides low cost auto parts to the public as it properly prepares raw materials for metal recycling.
